Learning objectives

Speaker

Louise Connell is Professor of Allied Health Rehabilitation. She works as a clinical- academic in a partnership post between Lancaster University and East Lancashire Hospitals NHS Trust. Her interest is in implementation research, and she is undertaking a programme of research into neurological rehabilitation. Her current research focuses specifically on implementation research for increasing intensity after stroke. Louise integrates implementation science into rehabilitation, demonstrating how its theories, models and frameworks can address real-world challenges. Her work has provided actionable insights and practical guidance to clinicians and researchers alike. A key achievement is her work on the GRASP program for upper limb rehabilitation after stroke, which is now implemented in over 200 sites across five continents, informing clinical guidelines and increasing uptake in the UK, where more than 50% of therapists report regular use (Yang et al, 2023).

Louise has led the development of scalable and sustainable interventions, such as the NeuroRehabilitation OnLine (NROL) innovation, which leverages telerehabilitation to address resource constraints while maintaining high-quality care delivery (Ackerley et al, 2023). This has now been included as an exemplar in UK National Clinical Guidelines, has been upscaled regionally with further upscale planned in 2025.

Louise has internationally recognised research outputs, with over eighty peer-reviewed publications, over 4000 citations, and a H-index of 31(Google scholar). She is a physiotherapist and is particularly passionate about improving research capacity and capability of Allied Health Professionals. She is chair of the NIHR Doctoral Clinical Academic Fellowship scheme. Her work has been recognised by being awarded a Fellowship of the Association of Chartered Physiotherapists In Neurology.
