#### Speakers/Workshop facilitators

Dr Liz Brewster is a Senior Lecturer in Medical Education at Lancaster University Medical School. She currently leads the NIHR-funded research project ,"Mapping underdoctored areas: the impact of medical training pathways on NHS workforce distribution and health inequalities". Her research examines the intersections between medical workforce, access to healthcare and quality of care.

Dr Jenny Humphreys is a Senior Clinical Lecturer at the Centre for Musculoskeletal Research, University of Manchester, and a Consultant Rheumatologist at the Kellgren Centre for Rheumatology at Manchester University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust. Dr Stephanie Ling is an NIHR Academic Clinical Lecturer in Rheumatology and an ST7 in Rheumatology and General Internal Medicine. Her research interests are in predicting treatment response in patients with rheumatoid arthritis. She is on the trusted reviewer panel for Arthritis Research and Therapy and regularly peer-reviews manuscripts for both rheumatology and cross-specialty medical journals.

Dr Alex Oldroyd is an NIHR Academic Clinical Lecturer in Rheumatology at the University of Manchester. His research focusses on myositis, specifically cancer screening.

Dr Matt Parkes is a Research Fellow in the Centre for Biostatistics. He is a keen advocate of novel clinical trial designs, transparency in clinical research, and use of novel technology to improve the quality and efficiency of clinical trials. The bulk of his experience is in musculoskeletal and oncology trials.

Dr Mia Rodziewicz is an MRC clinical research fellow in Pharmacology and Therapeutics at the University of Manchester. Her research focusses on the prediction of clinical response in systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE). She is also a trainee member of the BSR systemic autoimmune disease-related interstitial lung disease (SARD-ILD) working guideline group.

Dr Stephanie Shoop-Worrall is an MRC Career Development Fellow in Epidemiology and Data Science. Her work focuses on children and young people with juvenile idiopathic arthritis (JIA) and adults with psoriatic arthritis (PsA). She has particular interest in improving stratified medicine of these diseases across the lifecourse.

Dr Taqdees Suhail is a Rheumatology ST5 trainee in Mersey. She undertook foundation and core medical training in Manchester. Through her training, she has developed a keen interest in vasculitis.
